

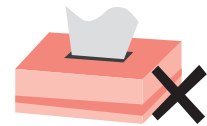

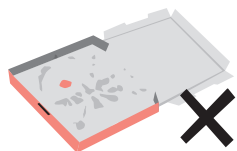

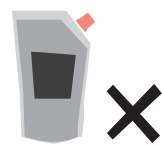

#### RECYCLING SAVES MONEY

It's 33% cheaper to recycle items than process them as waste. So the more you recycle, the less it costs your council and ultimately, you - the taxpayer.

#### RECYCLING HELPS PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

Recycling reduces the need for mining, quarrying, logging and refining - all of which create substantial air and water pollution.

#### RECYCLING SAVES ENERGY

UK recycling is estimated to save more than 18 million tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> a year - the equivalent to taking 5 million cars off the road.

# FIRSTLY, THANK YOU FOR RECYCLING

Your recycling materials are taken to a sorting facility in Norfolk. Teams of people **hand-sort your items** before they're mechanically separated into the raw materials needed to make new products.

## 3 SIMPLE RULES

Just a little bit of love from you ensures your recycling is turned back into new products and isn't wasted...



### CLEAN

Give your items a quick rinse. Any food or liquid left could contaminate other recycling.

### DRY

Wet items can also contaminate other recycling.

### LOOSE

Don't put carrier bags or sacks inside your wheeled bin. Bags cannot be opened at the sorting facility.

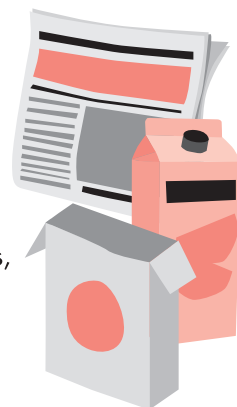
# NOT SURE WHAT YOU CAN RECYCLE?

Here's a detailed guide to the items you can put in your recycling bin...

## YES PLEASE

### PAPER

Clean paper, including newspapers, junk mail, magazines, cardboard boxes, envelopes, directories, shredded paper and cartons.



### GLASS

Dry empty bottles and jars of all colours with their lids on.



### METAL

Rinsed, empty steel and aluminium cans, clean foil, foil trays and aerosols.



### RIGID PLASTIC

Rinsed, empty bottles, pots, tubs and trays from around the home such as containers for: cosmetics, shampoo, shower gel, cleaning products including trigger sprays, detergents, yoghurt pots and bottles, margarine and ice cream tubs, fruit punnets, drink bottles and ready meal trays including black trays\*.
