

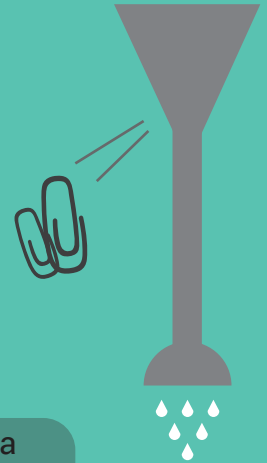

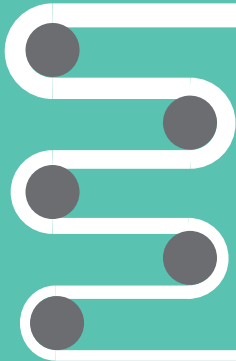
Paper collected from your home is sorted and 'pulped' - added to water and chemicals help separate the fibres.



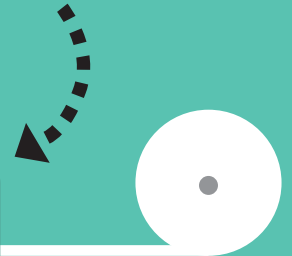
The pulp is spun to clean it, removing debris like paper clips. Colourants can be added at this stage.



The pulp is sprayed onto a mesh, forming a sheet and removing lots of the water, before being pressed.

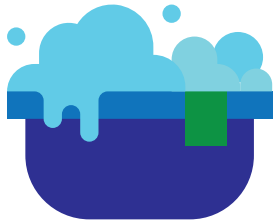


The paper then passes through a series of heated rollers to achieve the desired thickness, before being wound on a reel.



Your paper could come back as a cardboard box, newspaper or even a book!

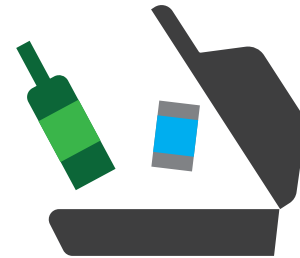
## Clean
